Key unusual species found were Velvet Shield, Rooting Shank and Yellow Shield, the later becoming quite frequent in Chaddesden Wood. The species found are indicative of mature woodland and dead wood habitats, there were a large number of different Bonnet Caps and of course the “company” of Stinkhorns.
